


#### **Project Need**

  - Primary Care Research Institute





- Advanced graduate student studios, administrative offices, meeting rooms, and informal work areas





  - 5 Academic schools



#### **Main Street Gardens**

- 2 acre urban park located at east end of Downtown Dallas
- Developed by the City of Dallas, completed in 2009
- \$19M from the 2003 & 2006 City of Dallas Bond Programs
- Operated by Downtown Dallas Inc.
- Urban Design Award, Greater Dallas Planning Council
- Anchor and front yard for the redevelopment of Downtown Historic District







UNT Dallas College of Law

- UNT Dallas & UNT System Presence
- UNT System purchased former Titche-Goettinger Department Store buildings in 2008 (1900 Elm and 1901 Main)
- 1901 Main previously owned and renovated by Dallas County Community College District and operated as the Universities Center at Dallas
- \$29M renovation by UNT System completed in 2013
- 171,000 GSF
- Houses UNT System offices
- Temporary home to UNT Dallas College of Law
- Continues to house Universities Center at Dallas
- Connected to 1901 Elm 127 apartment units (renovated in 1997)


