University of Calgary

- 24,000 undergraduate and 5,500 graduate students attend the University of Calgary.
- Founded in 1945 as a branch of the University of Alberta, the University of Calgary became established as an autonomous institution in 1966.
- The U of C is one of Calgary's fourth largest employers with 2,600 teaching staff and 2,800 management, professional and support staff.
- The U of C is composed of 13 faculties, 55 departments, 36 research institutes, with over 150 programs awarding bachelors, masters and doctorate degrees. The U of C also includes a teachers' college, medical school, law school and veterinary school.

Existing Facilities:

With the completion of the TFDL,
200,000sqft of current library space
will become available in MLT & MLB
for repurposing and renovation in the
heart of campus.

Existing library buildings are over stacked, unorganized and outdated.
Substantial structural, mechanical, electrical, building envelope and life
safety alterations are required.

MLT, MLB & Nickle Arts Museum

Currently contain the majority of University holdings (art, books, archives, periodicals, maps, etc)
Sites: Main campus

TFDL

Will contain 35% of University holdings and increased access to thousands of digital resources. New museum space will contain rotating exhibits of University art collections
Site: Main campus 'Heart of Campus'

HDL

Will contain 65% of University holdings with additional space for future storage requirements.
Site: Spy Hill (off campus)



High Density Library (HDL)

Services?

- *User-initiated retrieval:* Students, staff and faculty able to request items online and indicate when/where they want the material delivered.
- *Customized retrieval:* Staff in the HDL can pull large sets (journal runs, call number ranges, and archival docs) and provide space for reviewing material in secure and bookable reading rooms.
- *Desktop delivery:* Where copyright permits, articles from U of C's print journal collections will be scanned and sent to the researcher's desktop as requested.

What is a High Density Library?

- Environmentally controlled storage facility used for storage and preservation of books, journals, archival files, architectural drawings, and art.



Advantages?

- *Environmental controls:* Preserve and increase the life span of valuable materials and resources.
- *Space Recovery:* In the past, as collections grew, student, faculty and service spaces were pushed out to accommodate growing collections. The HDL allows U of C to store less frequently used materials off campus, while providing high-use materials in the main library and backfilling previous book storage space on campus with much needed teaching and learning space.



TFDL: Library of the future...

"The Taylor Family Digital Library is an excellent example of how infrastructure links directly to a student's experience on campus. When this building is completed next year, it will house state-of-the-art teaching, learning and research tools. We picture this building as a hub for our students, staff and faculty – a place where they can meet to discuss ideas in person or by video conference, access information from around the world online, and tackle tough questions by using the latest research tools such as 3D visualization, interactive Smart boards and high-powered computer technology."






TFDL: Library of the future...

More than just a building with books, the TFDL is a place for the 21st-century scholar to learn, to study, to collaborate, to research, to explore, to create. For the TFDL to be a "library of the future" it will have:

- Multimedia labs for students and faculty
- Multimedia editing suites
- Triple the number of public computers and of student workrooms (as compared to the existing library on campus)
- Presentation practice rooms with recording and projection capability
- 3D Visualization Lab
- Video Conferencing
- Expanded 'Learning Commons'
- Collaborative workrooms
- Wireless Cafe
- Presentation practice rooms
- Audio-visual viewing rooms
- Editing and recording suites
- Multimedia labs and computer-equipped classrooms
- Quiet reading rooms
- A prominent, public media wall displaying changing information about the building itself (such as energy being consumed, internal atmospheric data, etc), campus announcements, student work, etc.

Program



Primary Programmatic Groups

Libraries and Cultural Resources (LCR): Develops, preserves and provides access to large collections of print, archives, digital and 3D objects (~232,000sqft)

Nickle Arts Museum: 3 stunning galleries will be located on the first two floors of TFDL (~12,500sqft)

Canadian Architectural Archives (CAA): The world's largest collection of Canadian architectural records, drawings, models and photos (~1500sqft)

Special Collections: Features rare and unique literature, art, music, archives, etc. (~4000sqft)

University Archives: Manages the U of C Archives Program and Information Management Program (~3250sqft)

University of Calgary Press: Publishes scholarly works (~2500sqft)

Student Success Centre: Provides learning support for students (~8250sqft)

Alumni Association: Develops and supports various alumni and student activities. (~1000sqft)




TFDL will...



Site Plan & Quad Design




- Quad: 285,000sqft

Main Floor Plan




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Floor 2 Plan




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
Floors 3&4 Plan



Raised Access Flooring










Details: Metal Mesh



Fully glazed 'podium' (main and second levels) will be clad with **Cambridge metal mesh panels**. These mesh panels act as large sun shades, saving energy by reducing heat load and reducing glare on work surfaces and digital screens. The appearance of the mesh varies in different lighting conditions, creating a dynamic surface effect on the building's façade during the day.




The mesh provides a unique alternative to traditional shading systems and creates a canvas for nighttime digital projections on the building's exterior.



MLT/MLB Repurposing




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Extensive building condition assessments revealed the need for substantial upgrades to building envelope, mechanical, electrical, and life safety systems. Campus-side program studies and 'test fits' were completed to determine effective programmatic distributions/adjacencies/etc.



MLT/MLB sample floor plan



