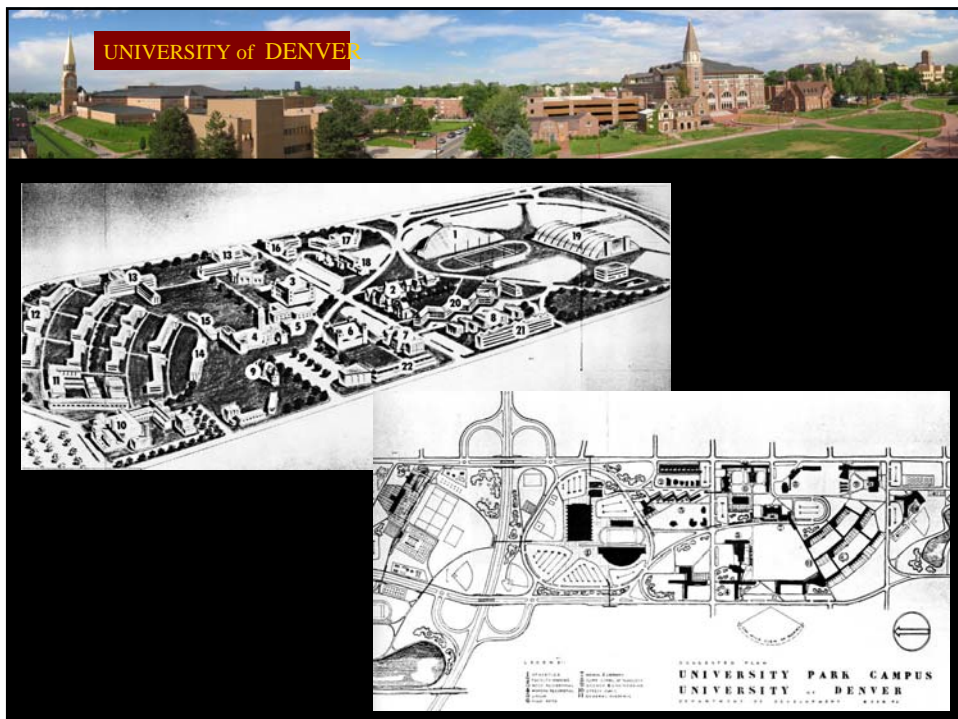


“Denver University and Yale University have the same number of students. The fundamental difference between the two institutions, however, is that Yale University has its buildings – Denver University does not.

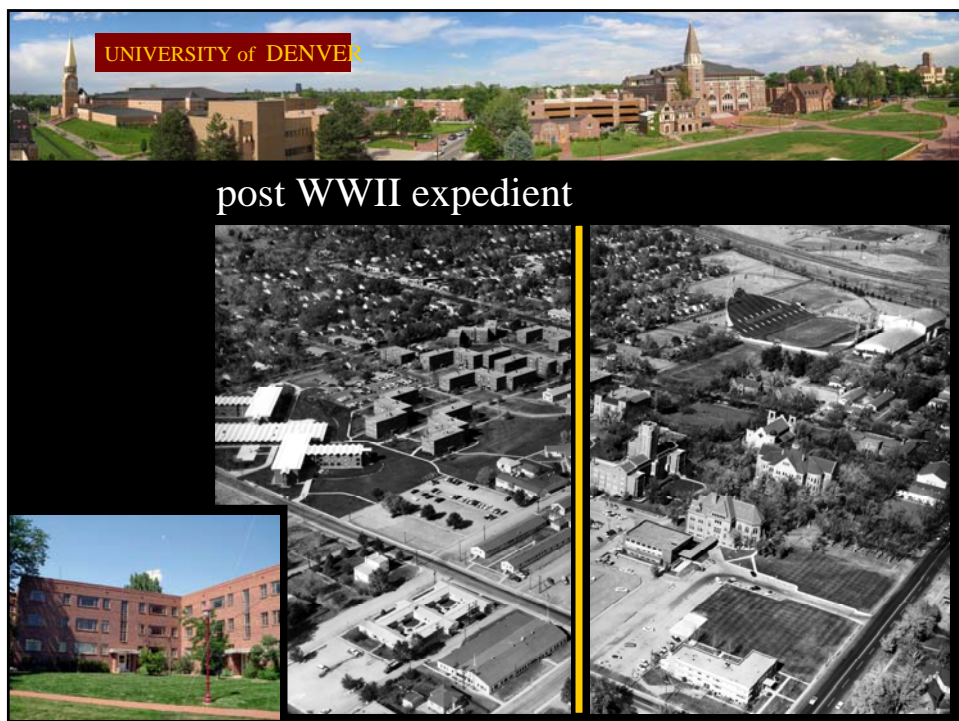
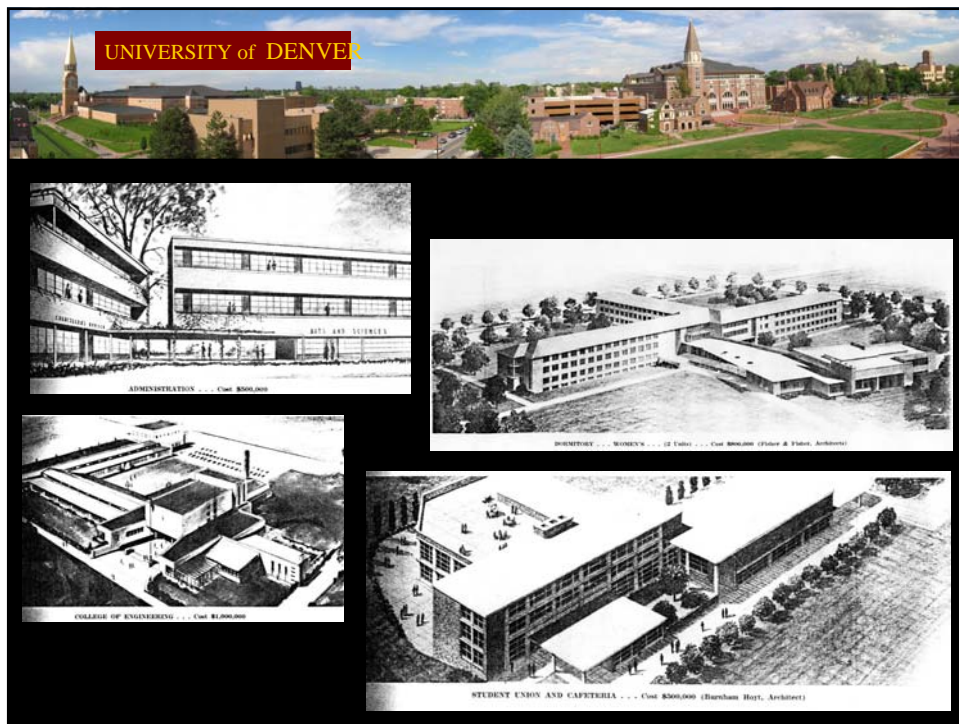

therefore as long as the function is the same, then the form can be used



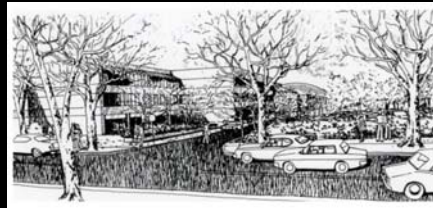

By 2007, we have added 22 buildings, Demolished 11, and renovated and Crafted additions to another 6.

We have invested \$500 million and brought forth a net 2,630,000 gsf. Over half of the campus is now less than ten years old.

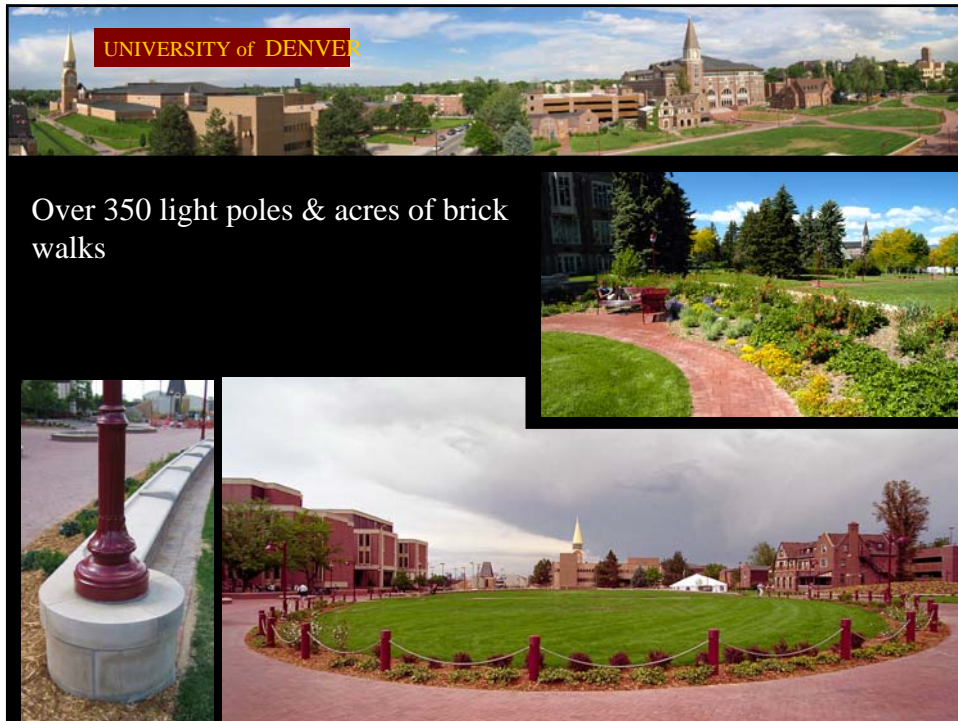

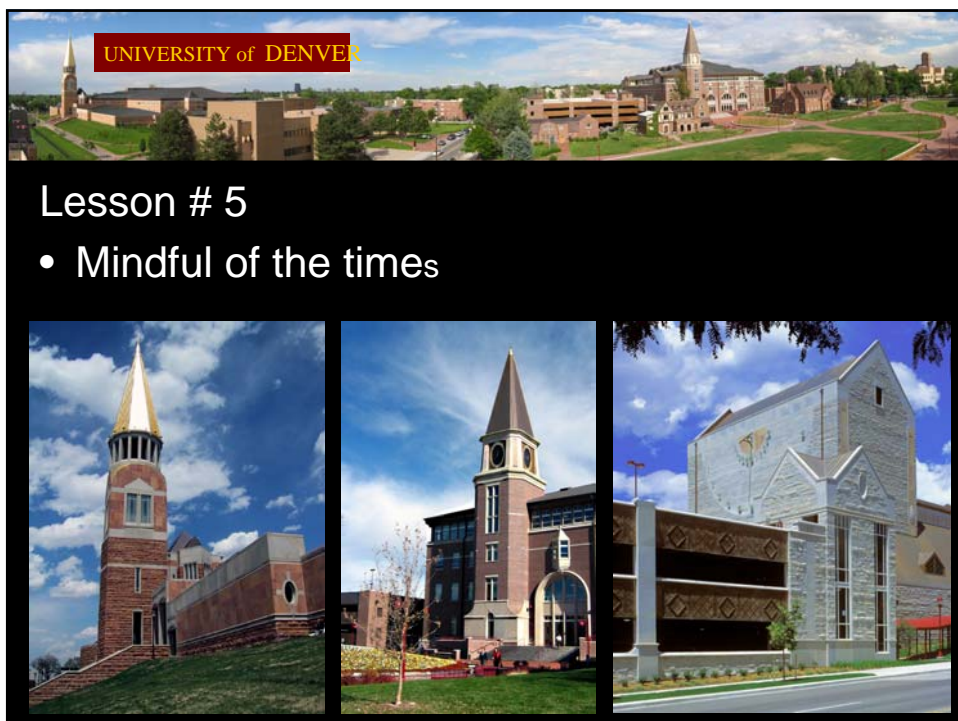

## Obstacles

- Chancellor Ritchie did not see the need for a master plan at first, or upon second thought ... not until after the sale

“do something that hasn’t been seen before”

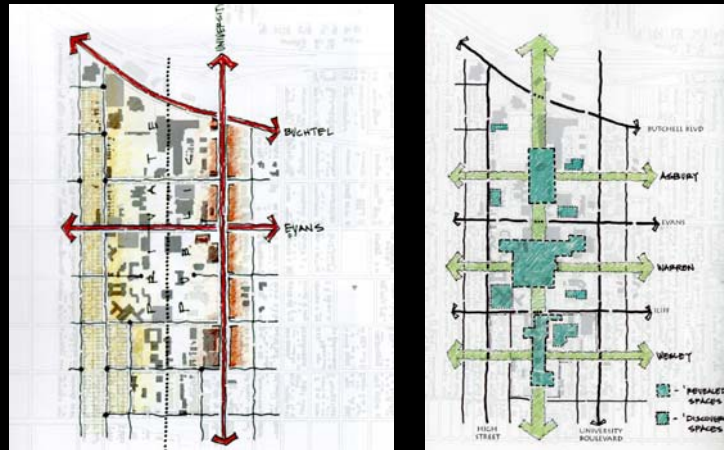
