- Strong influence on ecclesiastical architecture in Richmond.






First Baptist Church Built 1780. Rebuilt 1878.

  - Hunton Hall originally had a steeple with a bell....then came the civil war.







The bell from Hunton Hall at the First Baptist Church

  - Alumni interest













- Design Begins

  - Evaluated sense of place.




- Sense of Place inside

  - Special grand opening just for students








